BASIC INFORMATION

The International Expert-Conference on Human Rights of older Persons, organized by the Federal Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs, Health and Consumer Protection, will take place in Vienna from 12-13 November 2018.

VENUE

ACCREDITATION AND ACCESS

Upon arrival, panellists and keynote speakers will receive their accreditation badges from liaison officers.

Other participants can obtain their accreditation badges on-site from the registration desk on 12th November from 9 to 10 a.m. at the Ringturm.

ACCOMMODATION

The Federal Ministry has made a pre-reservation at the Hotel Regina (Rooseveltplatz 15, 1090 Vienna):



You are kindly asked to book and pay for your accommodation and to confirm your stay in the accreditation system (booking and hotel costs for panelists, moderators, and keynote speakers are covered by the Federal Ministry).

A certain number of rooms with a preferential rate of EUR 120,- (*per night/single room*) or 150,- EUR (*per night/double room*) has been pre-reserved for this event. TRANSPORTATION

You are kindly asked to organize your own transport to and from Vienna.

The city centre is located 20 km from Vienna International Airport and is easily accessible by public transport.

a) Train Connections

The Austrian Federal Railways (ÖBB) offers a Railjet service that connects Vienna Airport with Vienna Hauptbahnhof (main train station) in approximately 15 minutes. There are also direct connections to the city center with the S 7 rapid transit railway.

b) Airport Shuttle Service

The City Airport Train (CAT) offers a direct non-stop connection between Vienna Airport and the city center in 16 minutes (Wien Mitte train station – Bahnhof Wien Mitte).

c) Vienna Airport Lines

The Vienna Airport Line offers a direct bus service to various destinations in the city center and to the meeting venue.

d) Taxis

There is a taxi stand opposite the arrival hall's exit at the airport. A taxi ride from the airport to Vienna city center typically costs between EUR 40,- and EUR 50,-.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Vienna has a fully integrated public transport network. The underground, trams and buses run every day from approximately 5:00 a.m. until just after midnight. On Fridays and Saturdays the underground runs all through the night. For environmental reasons we suggest to use public transport whenever possible.

LUNCH & DINNER

On both conference days, lunch will be served at the conference venue – Ringturm.

It is located in the heart of Neustift am Walde (*part of Vienna*), between the vineyards and the Wienerwald. It offers an unforgettable ambience with its excellent wines and delicatessens, romantic courtyard and traditional music.

Austria uses Central European Time (CET), which is UTC plus 1 hour.
